## Safety Educator

Hi, allow me to introduce myself, my name is Mark "Marcus" Baudhuin, I am your new Region C Educator. My real name is Mark, but my "bike" family knows me as Marcus. My wife Diana & I reside near Green Bay, WI. My thanks to Rick Hinrich & Don & Judy Coons for their confidence in me to appoint me as Region C Educator. I have been riding Goldwings for about 22 years, & currently ride a black 08 ABS. I have been involved in rider education for alot of those 22 years. This article will be in both the Wisconsin & Region C newsletters. We just finished a great & safe Region C Rally & will be heading to Gold Rush in Lexington, Ky.

Now for this months newsletter topic-summer warm weather riding. We finally have warm/hot weather in Green Bay & as I am writing this it is 80 degrees & humid. The main key in my opinion for safe hot weather riding is proper riding gear. It is important to keep the skin covered with either lightweight clothing or

the new mesh jackets. The new mesh jackets are wonderful; they let the air through & still allow your body to cool thru sweat evaporation. But in order to perspire, you have to remain hydrated. This means increasing your fluid intake. Water or a sports drink, such as Gatorade, are what you need, not coffee, soda or any adult beverages. When I'm getting ready for a long hot weather ride, ideally a few bottles of water per person kept cold in a small cooler would be great. But if taking a cooler is not possible, I like to freeze a couple of 1/2 full bottles of water the night before & wrap them in a towel & tuck them away in the saddlebag or the trunk. Take along one cold bottle of water & mix it in with the partially froze water when you take a rest or gas stop. Or stop along the way & purchase the water as you need it. Don't wait until you're thirsty- drink some water whenever you can, drink more than you think you need. This will allow your body to keep you cool. If it is extremely hot, consider riding in the early morning or late evening taking a break during the heat of midday.

## *Safety Corner*

### Tornado Myths and Truths

- **Myth: Areas near lakes, rivers, and mountains are safe from tornadoes.**

Truth: No place is safe from tornadoes. A tornado near Yellowstone National Park left a path of destruction up and down a 10,000 foot mountain.

- **Myth: The low pressure with a tornado causes buildings to "explode" as the tornado passes overhead.**

Truth: Violent winds and debris slamming into buildings cause most structural damage.

- **Myth: Windows should be opened before a tornado approaches to equalize pressure and minimize damage.**

Truth: Leave the windows alone. The most important action is to immediately go to a safe shelter.

- **Myth: If you are driving and a tornado is sighted, you should turn and drive at right angles to the storm.**

Truth: The best thing to do is to seek the best available shelter. Many people are injured or killed when remaining in their vehicles.

- **Myth: People caught in the open should seek shelter under highway overpasses.**

Truth: Take shelter in a sturdy reinforced building if at all possible. Overpasses, ditches, and culverts may provide limited protection from a tornado, but your risk will be greatly reduced by moving inside a strong building.

## How far away is the Thunderstorm?

Count the number of seconds between a flash of lightning and the next clap of thunder. Divide this number by 5 to determine the distance to the lightning in miles.

- **Myth: If it is not raining, then there is no danger from lightning.**

Truth: Lightning often strikes outside of heavy rain and may occur as far as 10 miles away from any rainfall. This is especially true in the western United States where thunderstorms sometimes produce very little rain.

- **Myth: The rubber soles of shoes or rubber tires on a car will protect you from being struck by lightning.**

Truth: Rubber-soled shoes and rubber tires provide protection from lightning. The steel frame of a hard-topped vehicle provides increased protection if you are not touching metal. Although you

may be injured if lightning strikes your car, you are much safer inside a vehicle than outside.

- **Myth: People struck by lightning carry an electrical charge and should not be touched.**

Truth: Lightning-strike victims carry no electrical charge and should be attended to immediately. Contact your local American Red Cross chapter or your Safety Director, Marcus Baudhuin for information on CPR and first aid classes.

- **Myth: "Heat lightning" occurs after very hot summer days and poses no threat.**

Truth: "Heat lightning" is a term used to describe lightning from a thunderstorm too far away for thunder to be heard.

## 30/30 Lightning Safety Rule

Go indoors if after seeing lightning, you cannot count to 30 before hearing thunder. Stay indoors for 30 minutes after hearing the last clap of thunder.



## Who's Most at Risk?

### From Lightning:

People who are outdoors, especially under or near tall trees in or on water, or on or near hilltops.

### From Flash Flooding:

People who walk or drive through flood waters.

## From Tornadoes:

People who are in mobile homes and automobiles

## When Threatening Weather Approaches:

- Postpone outdoor activities if thunderstorms are imminent. This is your best way to avoid being caught in a dangerous situation.
- Move to a sturdy building or car. Do not take shelter in small sheds, under isolated trees, or in convertible automobiles. Stay away from tall objects such as towers, fences, telephone poles, and power lines. If lightning is occurring and a sturdy shelter is not available, get inside a hard top automobile and keep the windows up. Avoid touching any metal.
- Utility lines and metal pipes can conduct electricity. Unplug appliances not necessary for obtaining weather information. Avoid using the telephone or any electrical appliances. Use phones ONLY in an emergency.
- Do not take a bath or shower during a thunderstorm.
- Turn off air conditioners. Power surges from lightning can cause serious damage.

## If Caught Outdoors and No Shelter Is Nearby

Find a low spot away from trees, fences, and poles. Make sure the place you pick is not subject to flooding. If you are in the woods, take shelter under the shorter trees.

If you feel your skin tingle or your hair stand on end, squat low to the ground on the balls of your feet. Place your hands over your ears and your head between your knees. Make yourself the smallest target possible and minimize your contact with the ground. DO NOT lie down. If you are boating or swimming, get to land and find shelter immediately! Remember, if you can hear thunder - you are close enough to be struck by lightning!
